

DANIEL JAY GENOVA

Was born in Wyoming and grew up in Colorado. He attended Colorado State University where he received a BFA degree 1980. Upon graduation he quickly immersed himself in the Denver art community where he had his first professional one person show “City – Folk”. He later founded a cutting edge cooperative arts space entitled “Chroma – Zone”. While Denver was fertile ground to develop as an artist, the market for art at that time in what was a depressed economy was weak.

New York was calling! Everything he saw happening in the NY culture of the early 80’s through art, music and cinema excited him so he packed up his van and moved to Brooklyn, cold turkey and has never looked back! In Brooklyn he founded and directed two contemporary art venues “Wisteria” in Carroll Gardens and “Space Station” in South Park Slope. Both spaces showcased many artists that have gone on to have illustrious careers in their field. His art and poetry publications such as “Cornea Suitcase”, “A Little Melodrama” and “Holiday” are represented in fine art establishments such as Printed Matter and St. Marks Bookstore located in NYC. His poetry has been recited on WFMU, a New Jersey free form radio station. He currently is in the process of finding a publisher for “Auggie’s BIG Question” a children’s book about art and self awareness inspired by his son August. He has shown his work both nationally and internationally and his work is in many private and public collections. His last one person show was entitled “Ditties” in 2014 which showcased at The Giacobetti Paul Gallery located in DUMBO and directed by Stephen Paul.

Besides art, running is another passion of Daniel’s. He has run since he was a child. He has completed many races, including six marathons. In 2001 he set a master’s record for a marathon held in Newport, Oregon. For him running is a form of meditation and clears artistic blocks.

He currently lives in Bensonhurst with his partner Tracy and their son August and his studio is in the MADarts building on 18th St, in South Park Slope where he has worked and enjoyed the camaraderie of fellow artists for the last four years.
